From the Desk of Fr. Andrew:
Eucharistic Revival

We will have a five week preaching series on the Eucharist every **Sunday in October beginning on the weekend of September 30/October 1 and ending on the weekend of October 28-29.** The Bishop has changed the readings of those Sundays so that priests and deacons can preach explicitly about the Eucharist. All the special readings for those weekends in October are already available and the lectors and musicians will receive their copies. If by the end of this week you have not yet received your copy, please check with the parish office.

Additionally, the members of the Eucharistic Revival Committee met on Monday, September 11 and among other things decided on the date to begin the practice of sacred silence after Holy Communion as part of our parish activities during the parish year of the National Eucharistic Revival. So, **beginning the weekend of October 7-8,** at all our Masses, we will begin observing a brief period of silence, approximately two minutes, after Holy Communion before the prayer after communion. This will be an important way for us to grow in intimacy with the Lord, whom we will have just received during Holy Communion, as we seek to ask him to revive his love in our hearts. The silence will begin when the priest or deacon purifying the sacred vessels sits down. At that moment, the song being sung will be brought to a conclusion and the period of silence starts.

Message which arrived via our Diocesan Mailing: St. Joseph's in Beaulieu Bishop Cozzens and the Office of Stewardship and Development would like to thank the parishioners of St. Joseph's in Beaulieu for making their 2023 goal so early in the Annual Appeal year. Your faith and stewardship of diocesan ministries is a heartening sign of the Holy Spirit working throughout the Diocese of Crookston. God bless you.

All-School Mass

PLEASE NOTE: The Grandparents Meal scheduled for September 20th has been changed to Thursday September 28th at 11:30 due to a scheduling conflict.

St. Michael's Catholic School Update: After two months (16.6%) of the 2023-24 Fiscal Year Operating Budget follows: Income was at \$51,501.11 of \$401,223.00 budgeted income (12.8%). Expenses were at \$75,262.64 of \$560,456.54 budgeted expenses (13.4%).

FYI – since the end of last month we have been able to lower our projected deficit for this FY from \$159,233.54 to \$142,967.55. We are able to use Savings to make budget this year, however, we are diligently working on ways to increase revenue from other sources and keep expenses as low as possible.

At this time, we have not included interest income from our Endowment, but depending on the rate of return we may be able to do so. This projected deficit reminds all of us why we need Endowment Interest Income for our Operating Budget. Please continue to pray for the success of our Capital Campaign and invite others to support us with their gifts, too! Thank you.

We are marching along this week with a total of \$2,536,500 given in pledges and gifts to the campaign from 137 donors. \$1,431,000 has been received in gifts and pledge payments so far. Thank you to all who have been paying on their pledges so faithfully with no reminders from Mrs. Penner!

2023 DAA Report – Diocesan Goal Achieved!

8-19-23

Diocesan Goal is \$925,00.00. To date \$964,607.96 has been pledged (104% of goal) and \$898,552.36 has been received in payments, from 3183 donors, or 26% of diocesan parishioners/visitors. 42 Parishes have made their goal thus far. Last year 45 parishes made their goal by Dec. 31, 2022.

Our St. Michael's Goal is \$20,814.00. To date \$19,104.00 has been pledged (91.7% of goal) and \$16,555.00 has been received in payments, from 63 donors, or 24% of parishioners. Thank you to our 1 new donor for the gift of \$1000 since our last report! We are getting closer to our goal and carrying our share of responsibility to support all our diocesan ministries. Thank you!

Our St. Joseph's Goal is \$6,894.00. **Again, Congratulations!** To date \$11,370.00 has been pledged and paid, 165% of goal, from 25 donors, or 29% of parishioners. Our % of goal continues to be 2nd largest in the whole diocese. Great job!

FYI – you may use the 2023 DAA Summer Appeal Envelopes to make your gift for this year. They are available on the tables in the Gathering Space or entrance of the Church for each of our Parishes. Further, everyone can use these Envelopes to send in a **Prayer Request** to Bishop Cozzens & the Pastoral Center Staff as the Request will be prayed for at daily Mass in the Pastoral Center Chapel. Thank you!

St. Michael's Financial Update: After two months (16.6%) of the 2023-24 Fiscal Year Parish Operating Budget follows: Income was \$32,653.85 of \$311,456.58 budgeted income (10.5%). Expenses were \$65,985.46 of \$325,386.16 budgeted expenses (20%).

FYI – we have budgeted a deficit of \$13,929.58 for the new FY. Expenses are always higher for the first several months of the new FY due to paying for the full year expense for Property/Liability Insurance & Priest Retirement, 50% of the OND Subscriptions & Development Office Support, and the first quarter of the Diocesan Assessment. However, Sunday Offertory is only at 11% of the 16.6% plus needed to balance our expenses.

Sacrificial Giving Reminder: As our Parishes begin a new fiscal year we do ask all parishioners to prayerfully consider increasing your weekly stewardship support for all our parish ministries to reflect a “tithe” of your gross annual income. Are you giving 10% or more? Or 8% or 5%? It is suggested that ½ of your “tithe” be giving to the Parish Family and the other half divided among diocesan support (DAA) and worthy second collections/causes. Please make every effort to do so. Thank you!
